# Summary of Berner IWG Meeting held Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2011 Woodside Hotel, Kenilworth, England

Steve Green, President Pat Long, taking meeting minutes

- 1. Steve opened the meeting by welcoming everyone. Thanked all the clubs for sending delegates.
- 2. Meeting conducted in English.
- 3. Review of B-IWG for new informal gathering to facilitate information sharing between clubs. Last meeting conducted 2009, hosted by CIABS at Lake Garda Italy.
- 4. Clubs are members, one representative each. If you aren't giving feedback to the club, you need to drop out of the yahoogroup. Lindy Kunz suggested sending emails to each club president. Steve Greed sent invitations to every email he could identify. The yahoogroup contact is Pat Long, send her an email to join.
- 5. There seems to be a lack of interest. How can participation be fostered? This is not an action group, it's about sharing of health information. Martha Cehrs suggests a six month report cycle from each club representative.
- 6. Website discussed. Post the meeting minutes there, Pat Long to forward minutes to Birgitte. Six month report can be posted there. Presentations from the Symposium to be posted there. Birgitte is covering the cost of the website.

## 7. Fundraising:

- Martha Cehrs no fundraising for KBS
- Berndt Klingeborn SShK has about \$30,000, used for pilot studies. Funded by voluntary donations from breeders.
- Inge Bibby DBSK has about 200,000 Kroner, they host a fund day festival. The fund is mostly for Lisle and her projects.
- Ilona SSFS has a health foundation, breeders and pet owners donate. About 20,000€ used for getting samples for epilepsy, and DM testing.
  - Some clubs have health funds: Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Switzerland, GB, USA
- Steve Green UK gets extra donations on member renewals, it was used for the seminar  ${\sf Steve}$
- Silvana Vogel Tedeschi CIABS is not directly collecting donations, has a small health fund; 5€ donated for new members. Collaborates using University Studies.
- Pat Long BMDCA has an annual auction, please send any interesting items for that.
- 8. Degenerative Myelopathy. Pat Long provided a summary. 15 Berners with DM, 12 at-risk, 2 carriers, 1 clear. Clear had a second mutation which has not been found in any other breed. Carriers are still a question, slightly at risk, or an as-yet to be discovered mutation? Incomplete penetrance, need to determine how many at-risk Berners can be expected to get DM. Suggestion from geneticist: have the test done, try to breed with one partner clear, avoid carrier x carrier if there are any affected dogs in either lines.
- 9. Ron Smith (BMDCC) said that breeders are selling to disreputable breeders. Martha Cehrs (KBS) suggested letting breeding commission know who NOT to sell to, share facts, why are they bad. Clubs do have an unofficial blacklist. Lindy Kunz indicated that people are buying from disreputable breeders, people need to check for show results, club affiliation, and check with the club.

### 10. Discussion of issues.

- Lindy Kunz (VSSŌ) said there are too many dogs iwth missing teeth in Austria.
- Ireland breed for longevity first
- Inge Bibby (DBSK): why not just fault a kink tail. Only Swiss can change the standard. DBSK breeding commision only goes by the standard.
- Martha Cehrs (KBS): change of the standard to allow eliminating faults as long as he brings substantial benefit. Would only change breeding decisions in Switzerland.
- Berndt Klingeborn (SShK): disapprove by health issues, conformation up to breeder.

#### 11. National Updates

- Austria Isabella Kraft
  - 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this year
  - o 1996 hip and elbow xrays compulsory
  - o 1997 breeding animals had to take a temperament test
  - 2002 temperament test replaced by more comprehensive breeding evaluation, can be given over the age of 18 months; dog needs at least a

- very good from an FCI judge when the dog is over the age of 15 months; hips have to be A or B. C only under certain conditions: elbows can be 0 or 1
- Breeding rules continuously evaluated and updated. New rule requires any dog that dies before age 8 to have a full vet report sent to the breeding commission.
- Belgium Carla van Haute
  - DNA is now required for registration.
  - Two breeding clubs, about 90% are bred outside the clubs.
- Canada Ron Smith
  - BMDCC has existed for 32 years, has about 444 members, about 450 puppies a year
  - Club has voluntary code of ethics, recommendations
  - Club supports Berner-Garde
  - CKC does the registrations, no requirements are verified
- Finland Ilona Jaanu
  - No breeding commission
  - Keep a list of dogs over the age of 7
- UK Louise Harrington
  - o BMDC of GB is 40 years old, 1314 members
  - Bitch can't be older than 7 years to whelp a litter, or the litter can't be registered
  - No requirements for hip or elbow values, just that x-rays be done
  - Crufts now has 15 at-risk breeds, the best of breed winners for these breeds are examined by a veterinarian before the group competition
    - If the vets find them to be unsound, they don't continue to group
    - The KC defines the health issues for the breeds
    - Older judges are putting up unsound dogs
- Ireland Valerie Hughes
  - o Club was established in 1980, has 330 members
  - Working on a code of ethics, currently have no breeding requirements
  - o A lot of puppy farms, the club is working with them trying to educate
  - They use the website Done Deal, the club advertises there, advises the buyers on what to look for
  - The numbers of puppies being bred is causing the price to drop
- Italy Silvana Voqel Tedeschi
  - o CIABS is developing a code of ethics and breeding recommendations
  - Three studies
    - Skeletal Padua University
    - Longevity, developing EBV, value for longevity
    - Fertility
- Netherlands no one present
- Russia no one present
- Slovenia no one present
- Spain Norbert Strahl
  - Spanish KC defines that breeding male has to be at least 8 months, females at least 12 months
  - Bernese puppy price is holding, but there are a lot of new breeders (the price of Labrador Retrievers dropped 80%)
  - Club can become official if there are sufficient members
  - o If the club has pedigree power, it can control the breeding
  - Buyers want guarantees for hips and elbows
  - No animal welfare in Spain, younger people are more in tune with this
- Sweden Berndt Klingeborn
  - His presentation tomorrow will discuss longevity, morbidity, and breeding index
  - o Renal Dysplasia see one or two cases per year, also seen in Boxers

- DNA test in Canada, geneticist from Bern, Switzerland cannot recommend the test
- o Golmerulonephropathy there is a DNA test for Cockers
- Open registry for the last to years male dogs
- Switzerland Martha Cehrs
  - Small dogs becoming more popular
  - Golden Bäri Award gathering information by breeders
    - X-rays for at least 60% of the litter
    - Consulted statisticians
    - Compulsory requirements for the award
  - Morbidity & Mortality
    - Had voluntary information, not statistically valid
    - Worked with statisticians, got sample to gather in scientifically valid manner
    - Gives base line
    - Then get health population to follow dogs from cradle to grave
    - Want to use dogs used for compulsory x-rays
- BMDCA Julie Jackson
  - Power point presentation of club funded health studies
  - o CD provided to all attendees, gives list and descriptions of health studies
- Denmark
  - Club is 34 years old, the KC controls pedigrees
  - Fewer registrations, about 350 puppies
  - o Berner club has rules, works well with the Denmark KC
  - o Hip index, only uses Danish data, not background from other countries
  - o Breeding strategy, developing recommendations
  - It will be difficult to convince all the breeders to participate
- 12. Next health symposium in Switzerland. Martha Cehrs announced that the KBS will be coordinating with the European Dog show in Geneva in 2013, August 29 September 1. The Swiss KC is organizing the International show.
  - Thursday Swiss KC show
  - Friday Health Symposium
